

# Sask Parks "At a Glance Information" for the 2020 Reservation Launch:

We have another exciting season jam-packed with fun activities and adventures in Sask Parks, kicking off May 4, 2020 with camping opening June 1, 2020.

## Here is what you need to know about 2020

- Campers should buy an annual park entry permit online when reserving their site to limit contact.
- Camping in provincial parks will be restricted to Sask residents.
- Every other campsite will be closed (50 per cent occupancy).
- Northern campers should be aware of the travel restrictions in the north for Lac La Ronge and Narrow Hills and hold off booking campsites.
- All recreational facilities are closed – swimming pools, beach access, picnic areas, playgrounds, etc.
- Limited access to washrooms, and shower and laundry facilities are closed.
- Wood and water will be available for campers in a safe way. More details to follow.
- Visitors can use the parks in May without stopping at the entry gates (they are closed in May).
- Campers need to follow all advice of health officials (more info on [saskparks.com](http://saskparks.com) **Announcement Pg**)

## Seasonal and Group Reservations

- Seasonal campsites are available to reserve online again for 2020 (every other site) and pro-rated.
- Listings of available seasonal sites by park are displayed on our reservation website.
- NO group bookings for 2020 and 2021 at this time.
- June group reservations were cancelled and fully refunded.
- July-September group reservations will be reviewed and are not eligible for full refunds at this time.

## Camping and Entry Fees

- There are no fee changes for the 2020 Season.
- Fee changes for 2019 remain in place (change, cancel and no-show policies).
- A valid park entry permit is required year-round within Sask Parks.
- Seniors will be provided daily or weekly entry at the park gate (senior seasonal campers will provided an annual entry permit).

## Fall Camping

- All parks will offer fall camping through to the end of September 2020.

## Maximum stay

There is no longer a restriction on the duration of a stay in one particular site.
