The Saskatchewan Training and Education Council (STEC) works in partnership with the Saskatchewan Apprenticeship and Trade Certification Commission to provide opportunities for experienced front line workers to complete their Journeyman certification.

Apprenticeships support underrepresented groups in pursuing careers in the skilled trades.



The average age of new apprentices across all trades is **28.3** years old.

Food and Beverage Person Apprenticeship

People working in this trade sell and serve food and beverage products, mix and prepare alcoholic and non-alcoholic beverages.

Guest Services Representative Apprenticeship

People working in this trade promote, sell and book accommodation products and services.
